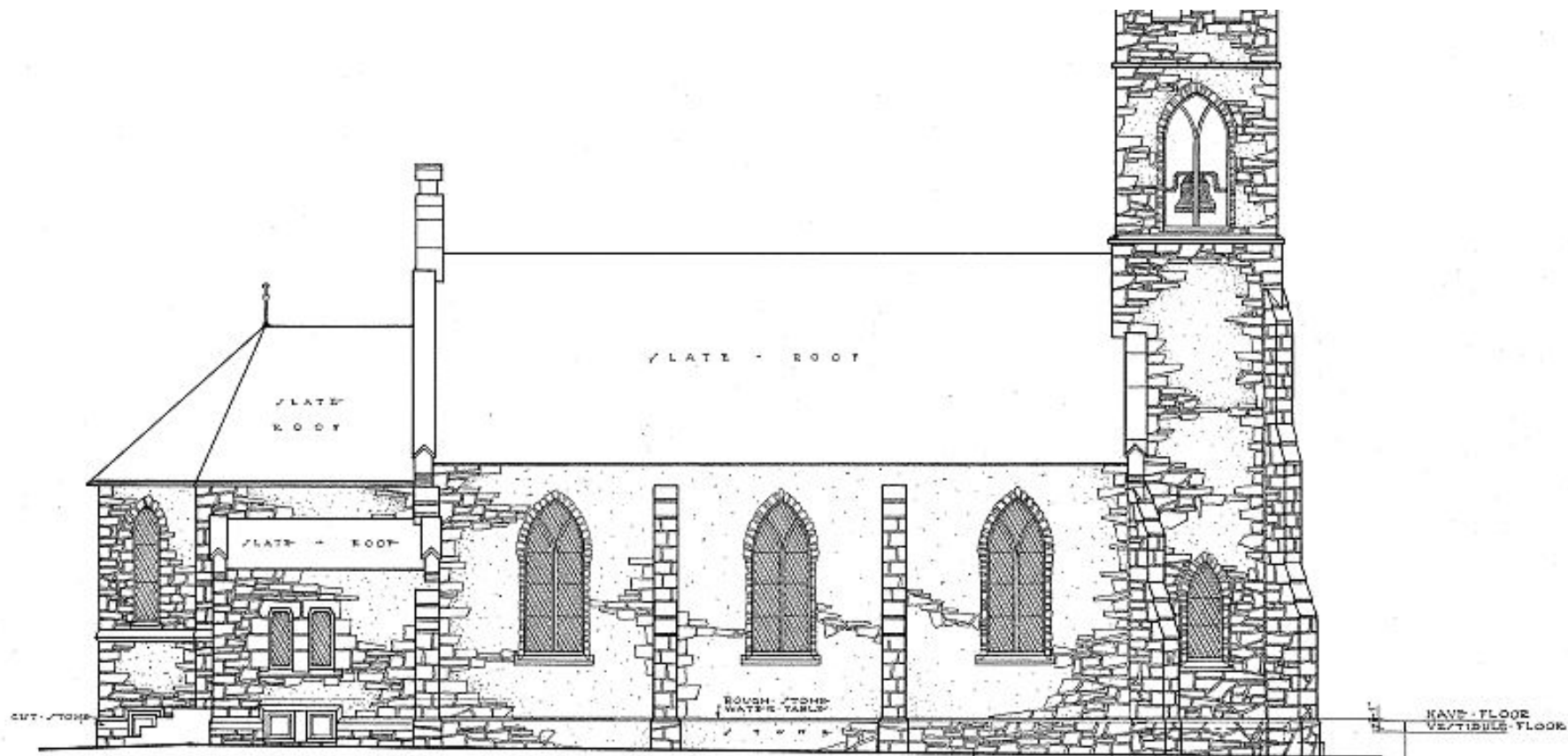

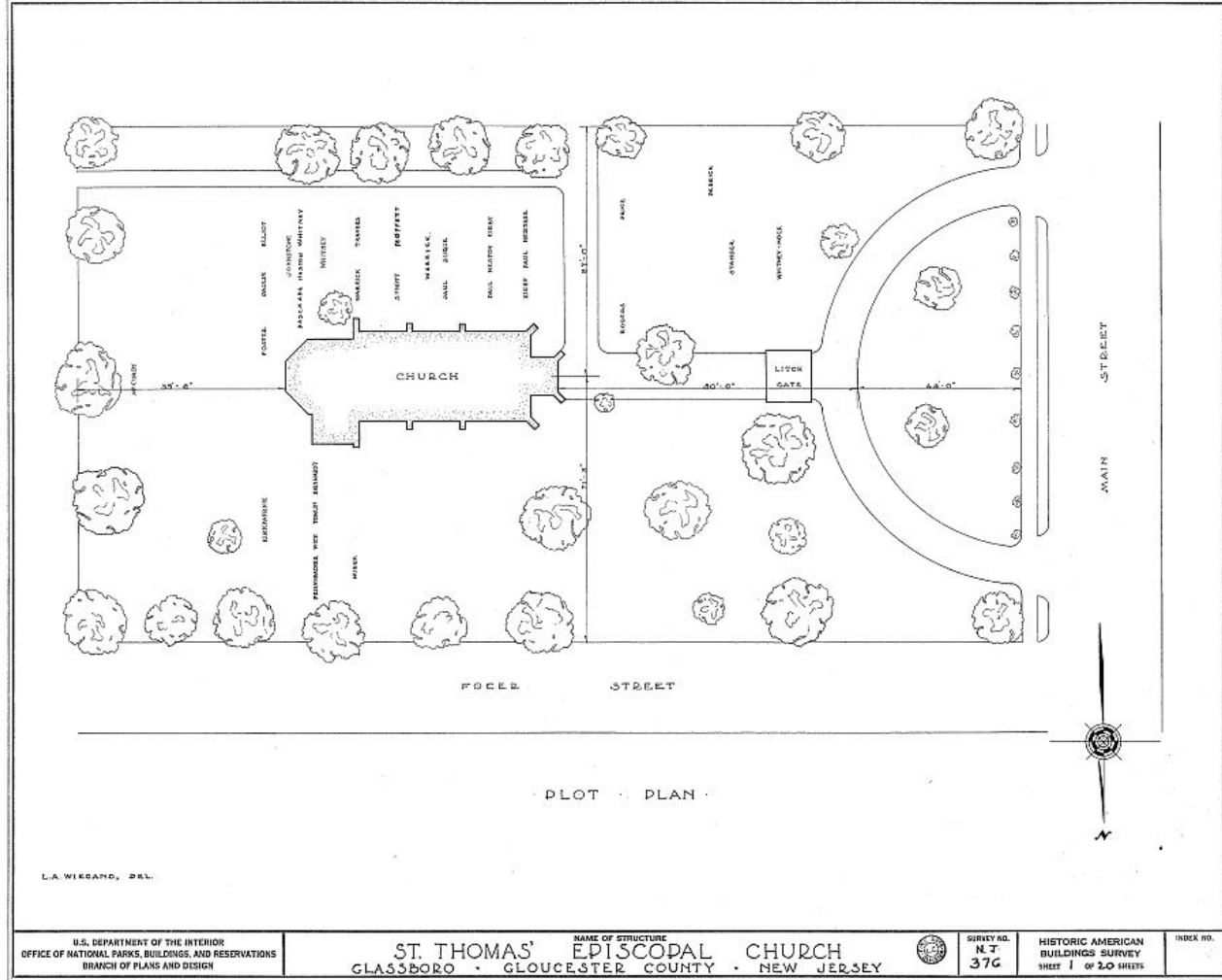




- NORTH - ELEVATION -

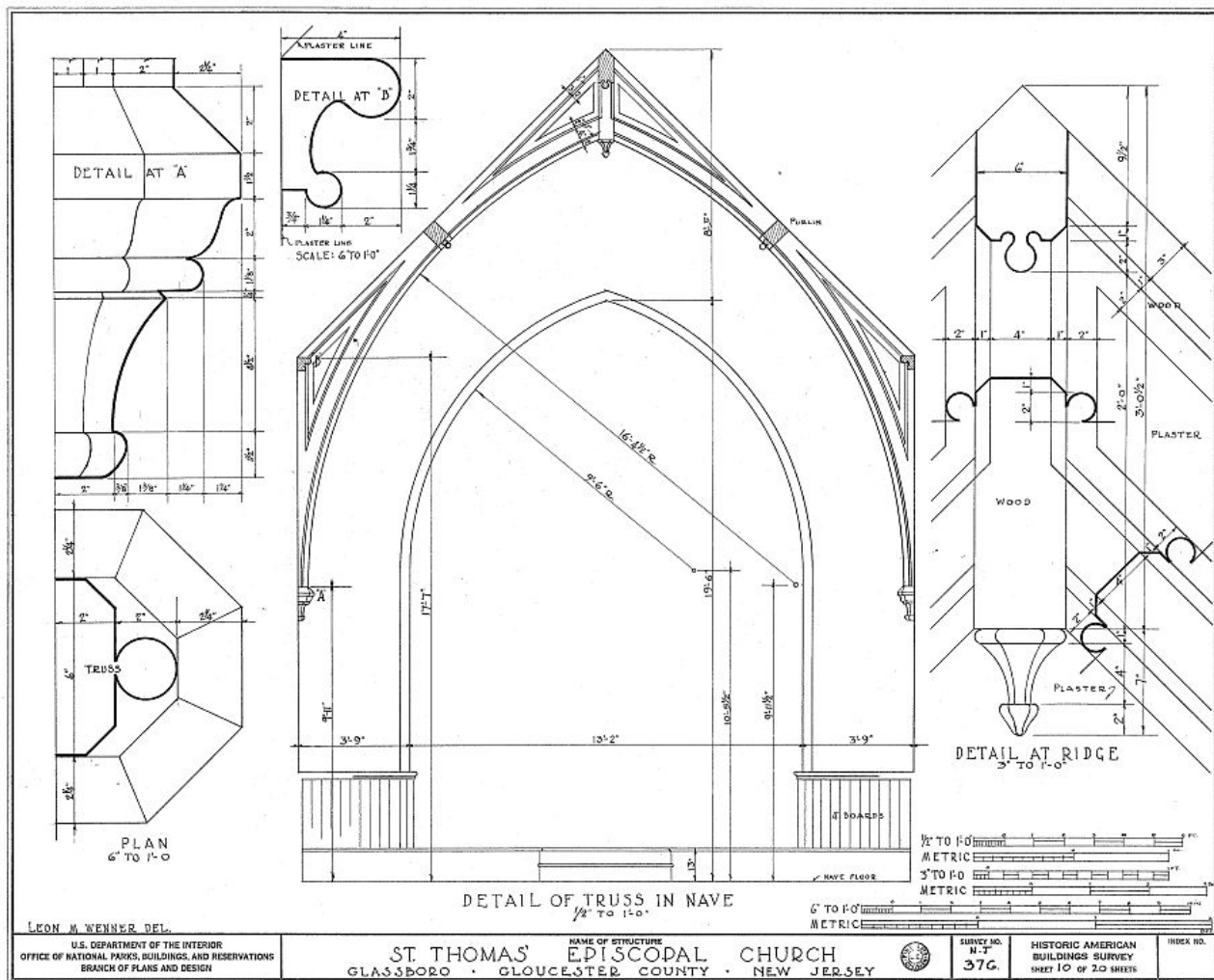

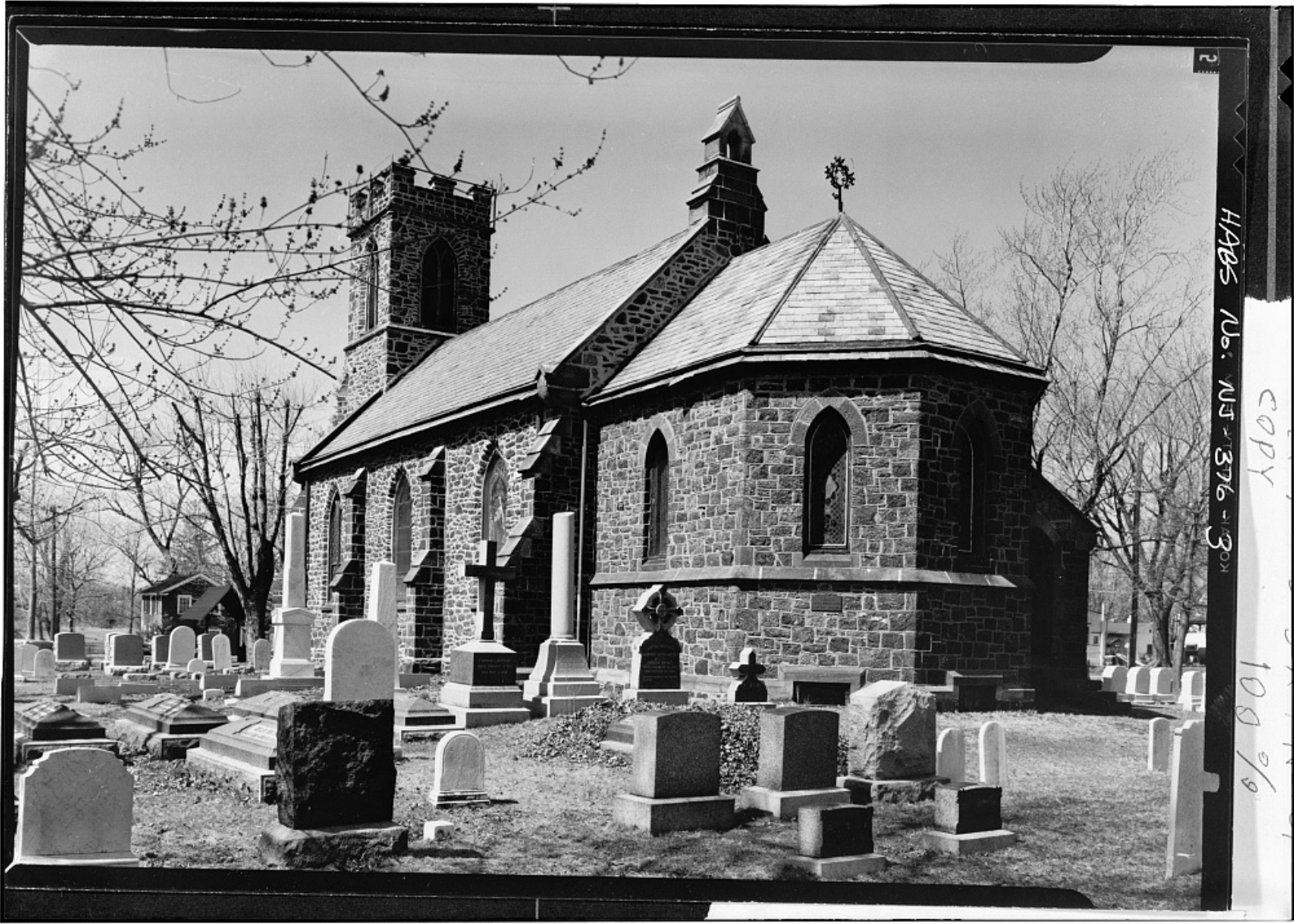

# Original St. Thomas Episcopal Church Sign

This is the sign of the first 'church' in Glassboro, which was made of wooden logs.

This building has been demolished, yet the sign still remains at it's former location, which is  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile north of the present-day St. Thomas Episcopal church.
